Project Summary:

The Webb County Drug Court under Webb County Court at Law #2, is proposing to serve 350 participants in a five -year project period funded by SAMHSA. The population of focus is composed of female and male adults in Webb County ages 18 and older who have been arrested for drug related charges and have an alcohol or drug use disorder, including those participants who have co-occurring mental health and alcohol/drug use disorders. The purpose of the project is to expand and enhance alcohol and drug treatment services provided along with recovery support services supporting substance abuse treatment, screening, assessment, case management, and program coordination. This project will link participants to Serving Children and Adults in Need, (SCAN) to provide the treatment component. Webb County envisions the provision of an efficiently coordinated, multi-system approach that will be integrated to the sanctioning power of the Drug Court with effective treatment services to break the cycle of criminal behavior, alcohol and/or drug use, and incarceration or other penalties. Webb County Court at Law #2 will utilize the leverage of the court to motivate Court participants to access comprehensive substance abuse treatment services and will coordinate mental health and trauma services for those participants with co-occurring disorders. The Court will also utilize assertive case management to link participants to community resources that can meet their overall needs and will engage participants in ongoing recovery opportunities and aftercare to help them sustain their recovery efforts.
