Geophysical Studies

Geophysical evaluations rely upon the application of physical principles to study the Earth's interior. 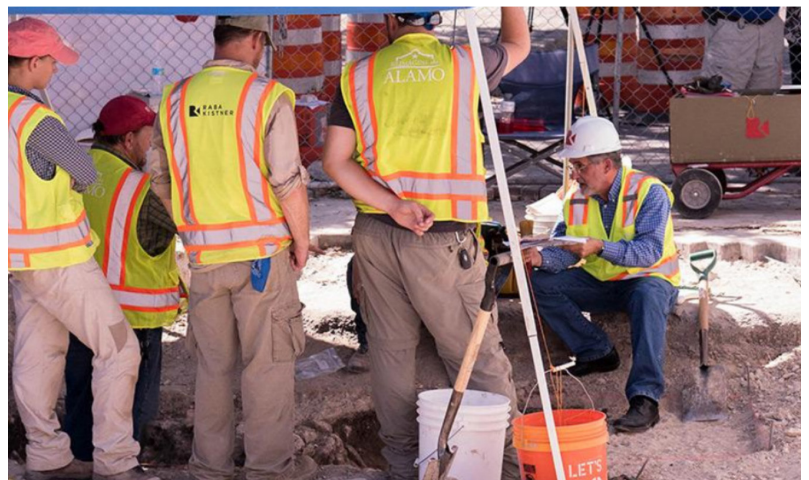

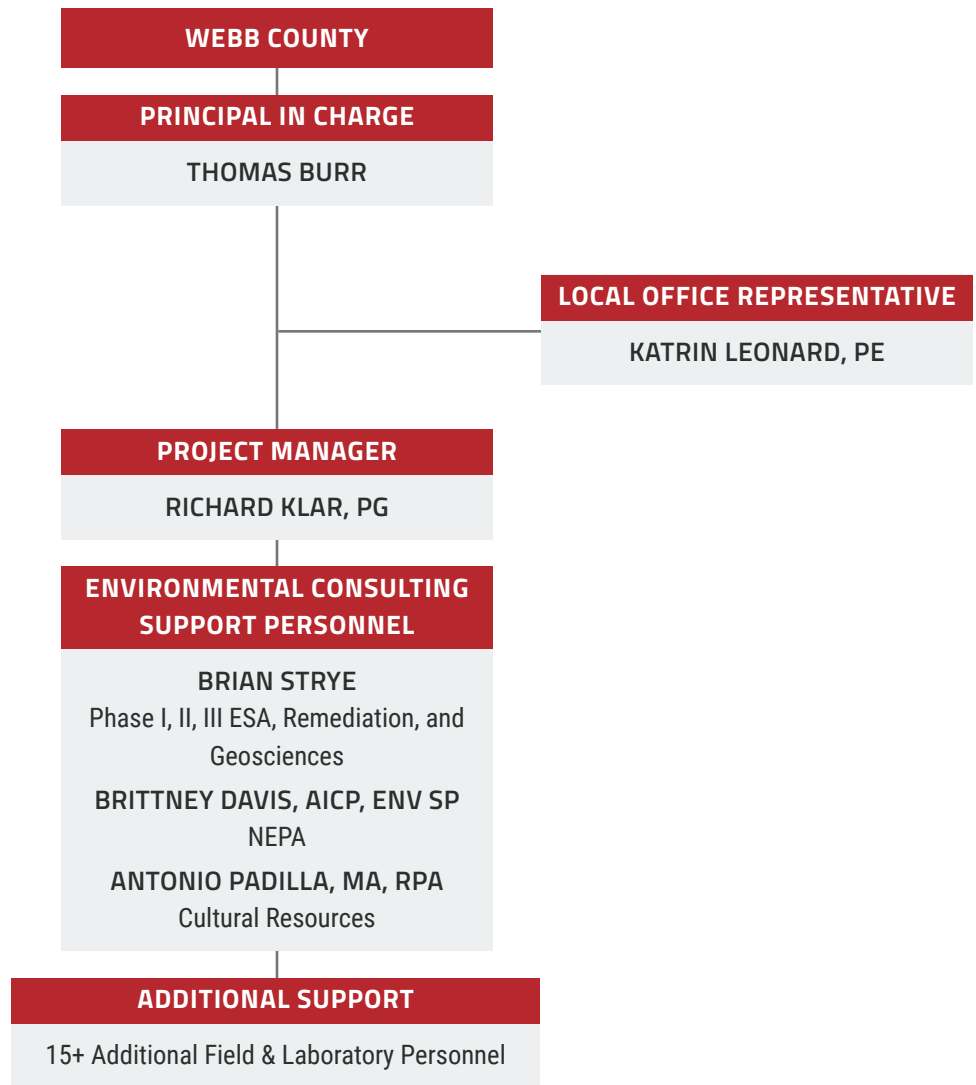

Raba Kistner conducted a Phase I Environmental Site Assessment (ESA-I) in accordance with procedures set forth by the American Society of Testing and Materials (ASTM) Practice E 1527-13 for a 2.52-acre infrastructure project corridor. As part of the project COSA would acquire additional drainage right of way along the swale within the Churchill Estates residential community in San Antonio, Bexar County Texas. The Churchill Estates residential community is subject to flooding during times of significant rainfall. The project is proposed to improve an existing drainage swale and provide culverts under community roadways, to convey storm water ultimately to Martinez Creek located east of the project. The ESA-I was conducted to inform the City of San Antonio Public Works Department of potential recognized environmental conditions (RECs) that could be encountered during excavation activities associated with the project. The assessment included a review of available historical information, interviews with the present owners, review of federal and state records, information request from local governments, and a physical reconnaissance of the property to identify any RECs associated with the property of adjacent properties. An Raba Kistner environmental professional, conducted SITE reconnaissance activities in December of 2021. As a result of the information reviewed no RECs were identified to be associated with any of the residential properties located adjacent to the proposed drainage right of way. Additionally, no past uses of the land adjacent to the proposed project were identified that could potentially pose an environmental concern. Therefore, no further environmental investigations were recommended.

Hemisfair Internal Streets

SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS | CITY OF SAN ANTONIO - PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Raba Kistner conducted a Phase II Environmental Site Assessment (ESA-II) on behalf of the City of San Antonio Public Works Department in support of the Hemisfair Internal Streets Project, which is located within the historical Hemisfair Park area in downtown San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas. Planned project improvements include approximately 2,600 linear feet of roadway construction for the proposed transportation corridor with corresponding storm sewer infrastructure (i.e., drain pipe and inlets). In addition, the initial phase of the project will involve the installation/re-routing of several underground utilities including potable water, sewer, and natural gas. The broad objectives of the assessment provided for further evaluation of baseline environmental conditions in addition to specific concerns identified as the result of the previous Phase I Environmental Site Assessment (ESA-I) study conducted on for the project corridor itself and adjacent properties.

Several recognized environmental conditions (RECs) were identified along the corridor that generally correlate to historical businesses or operations (no longer existing) with the potential to have hosted spills or releases of petroleum products or other hazardous substances that include an automotive repair and filling station, former junk yard, and former underground petroleum storage tank (UST) facility. Additionally, results of previous environmental assessment activities conducted by Raba Kistner and others have revealed the presence of pervasive fill soils throughout the Hemisfair Park area that exhibit select heavy metals concentrations (e.g., mercury and lead) in excess of naturally-occurring or background levels defined by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ). The presence of significantly elevated heavy metals concentrations in fill soils generally triggers special soils management requirements in conjunction with City of San Antonio capital improvements projects.

ESA-II activities discussed herein included the following primary components: (i) installation of nine environmental soil borings at locations within the project that will host various improvements, located as close as practicable to RECs identified as part of the previous ESA-I study effort; (ii) field-screening to evaluate the presence of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) that could be indicative of petroleum hydrocarbon or other volatile chemicals (e.g., chlorinated solvents) within the construction depth interval for planned improvements; and (iii) collection and chemical analysis of representative soil samples with subsequent data evaluation and reporting. The assessment was conducted specifically to assess the project right-of-way areas for the presence of significant impacts to soils within the planned construction depth intervals. As documented in our final ESA-II report, assessment results indicated that residual heavy metals impacts (predominantly lead) are present in surface soil within three areas of concern (AOCs) within the project corridor. Based on ESA-II findings, construction monitoring was recommended during all phases of shallow earthwork to occur within these AOCs. At the City's request, Raba Kistner provided additional recommendations for the proper management of affected soils that were incorporated into the work scope for the construction team.

City of Brownsville Culvert and Drainage Improvements

BROWNSVILLE, TEXAS | CITY OF BROWNSVILLE

Raba Kistner is currently assisting the City of Brownsville with two TWDB-funded projects. One involves an existing system consisting of three resacas (Resaca de la Guerra, Resaca del Rancho Viejo), and the other a 10-block area called the West Brownsville Drainage District and North Main Drain.

The first project involves improving eight culverts within the resacas that control flow between different sections using a system of weir structures, valves, and installing flap gates that will improve control of water flow. The purpose of the culvert improvements is to allow the City of Brownsville to be better equipped to control and deviate flooding in the most problematic areas. It will also allow the City to have more control over the flow of storm water within the resacas and give the city the ability to gather and disseminate flow and volume data to citizens, public officials, and state and federal agencies.

The West Brownsville Drainage area project is an undeveloped parcel on the western side of Old Military Highway that is currently being acquired by the City of Brownsville. Historically, the area to the east of this site has flooded due to the current flow-line path of storm water during heavy precipitation events. The purpose of this project is to shorten the distance storm water would have to travel to reach an outfall point. This improvement would help alleviate flooding within a ten-block radius in the area.

Based on positive experience with recent similar projects, Raba Kistner was asked to lead the EA for both projects, including agency consultations and public involvement activities. In July 2020, Raba Kistner also conducted a Virtual Public meeting on the City's behalf, which was a great success.

This project is federally reimbursed.

Projects seeking funding through the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) (authorized by the Clean Water Act) are subject to NEPA requirements. The project is anticipated to cost \$1,200,000 and will be completed by August 2021. The City of Brownsville is covering the cost of the planning and design with funds from the Texas Water Development Board covering the construction costs.
