JOB SUMMARY

This position is responsible for operating a truck in the maintenance of county requirements.

MAJOR DUTIES

- Performs daily check of tires and fluid levels on vehicle and equipment; performs minor repairs and maintenance as needed.
- Performs pre-trip and post-trip inspection of equipment.
- Operates a dump truck and belly dump truck to transport dirt and other materials to work sites.
- Operates a water and vacuum truck to water roads.
- Operates a patching truck in support of road maintenance and repair operations.
- Operates a refuse truck along an assigned route.
- Operates a grapple truck to pick up trash and tree branches.
- Operates a winch truck to transport equipment to and from work sites.
- Operates an emulsion distributor truck to seal asphalt roads.
- Installs cones and traffic control devices; flags traffic as needed.
- Responds to after-hours emergencies.
- Perform any other duties as assigned.

KNOWLEDGE REQUIRED BY THE POSITION

- Knowledge of county policies and procedures pertaining to road maintenance and repair.
- Knowledge of road construction and maintenance techniques.
- Knowledge of departmental and safety rules and regulations.

- Skill in operating assigned trucks and equipment.
- Skill in establishing safe work zones.
- Skill in the maintenance and repair of a variety of tools and equipment.
- Skill in the use of hand and power tools.
- Ability to communicate in English and Spanish.

SUPERVISORY CONTROLS

The Road and Bridge Supervisor assigns work in terms of general instructions. The supervisor spot-checks completed work for compliance with procedures, accuracy, and the nature and propriety of the final results.

GUIDELINES

Guidelines include county and departmental policies and procedures and supervisory instructions. These guidelines are generally clear and specific, but may require some interpretation in application.

COMPLEXITY/SCOPE OF WORK

- The work consists of related truck driving duties. Inclement weather, dangerous field conditions, and heavy traffic contribute to the complexity of the work.
- The purpose of this position is to operate trucks in support of the construction and maintenance of county roads and trash collection. Successful performance helps ensure safe and serviceable roads, bridges, and infrastructure.

CONTACTS

- Contacts are typically with co-workers.
- Contacts are typically to give and exchange information and provide services.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS/ WORK ENVIRONMENT

- The work is typically performed while sitting, standing, walking, bending, crouching, or stooping. The employee frequently lifts light and heavy objects. The employee must use tools or equipment requiring a high degree of dexterity.
- The work is typically performed outdoors. The employee is exposed to noise, dust, dirt, grease, machinery with moving parts, and inclement weather. The work requires the use of protective devices such as masks, goggles, safety helmets, ear protection and gloves.

SUPERVISORY AND MANAGEMENT RESPONSIBILITY

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- Must have one to two years experience as CDL with Tanker Endorsement.
- A high school diploma or GED from an accredited institution; preferred but not required.

OTHER REQUIREMENT/INFORMATION

- Texas DOT Physical Exam is required.
- Must possess a valid and current CDL Driver's License for the type of vehicle or equipment operated.
- Drug and Alcohol Policy applies to this job. Pre-employment drug/alcohol testing, Motor Vehicle Record (MVR) and criminal background checks are required.
- This position *is covered* by Civil Service; therefore, is subject to the Civil Service Rules and Regulations in addition to all other Webb County policies.
