Third Party Funding Agreement
By and Between

WEBB COUNTY, TEXAS

This agreement is made and entered into by and between the County of Webb, a political subdivision of the State of Texas, acting herein by and through its County Judge, as authorized by its Commissioners Court, (hereinafter referred to as "County") and the **Laredo Chamber of Commerce**, a 501(c)(6), acting by and through Mr. Adrian Zapata its Chairman of the Board.

The parties do agree and contract as follows:

ARTICLE 1 SCOPE OF SERVICES

Laredo Chamber of Commerce, covenants and agrees to provide the services set forth in the attached Exhibit "A" incorporated herein by reference as if set out in full during Webb County's fiscal year, being October 1, 2023 through September 30, 2024.

ARTICLE 2 PERSONNEL AND EQUIPMENT

Laredo Chamber of Commerce, agrees to furnish all personnel with the required skills and expertise needed to perform the above-mentioned services at no additional cost to the County other than as provided in Article 5. In addition, Laredo Chamber of Commerce, shall provide all necessary equipment, supplies, vehicles, utilities and miscellaneous expenses incurred in performing the scope of services at no additional cost to the County other than as provided in Article 5.

ARTICLE 3 REPORT TO COUNTY

Laredo Chamber of Commerce, shall submit a detailed annual report to the **Webb County Auditor** with copy of same to the **Webb County Treasurer**, which shall identify the services delivered and expenses incurred under this agreement. Said report shall be submitted to the County no later than September 30, 2024.

ARTICLE 4 DURATION OF CONTRACT

This agreement shall be in effect for 12 months beginning October 1, 2023 and ending September 30, 2024.

ARTICLE 5 COMPENSATION

County shall fund Laredo Chamber of Commerce, a total of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) for its services under this agreement, payable within fifteen (15) days of the Commissioners Court approval of this contract.

It is expressly understood and agreed by the parties hereto that the One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) is subject to the availability of funds. This One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) is the total maximum sum specifically allocated to fully discharge any and all liabilities that may be incurred by County under the provisions of this Agreement, regardless of the nature and notwithstanding any word, statement, or thing contained or inferred from the provisions of this Agreement, which might in any light by any person be interpreted to the contrary. It is expressly agreed that absolutely none of the funds granted by this agreement shall be used for any payroll expenses, employee wages, benefits and or salaries and failure to comply with this provision is a material breach of this contract and may obligate Laredo Chamber of Commerce to repay funds and/or disqualify Laredo Chamber of Commerce from applying for this grant in the future.

ARTICLE 6 NON-ASSIGNABILITY

Laredo Chamber of Commerce, shall not assign any interest in this agreement nor delegate the performance of any of its duties herein specified without the written consent of County.

ARTICLE 7 ACCESS BY COUNTY TO RECORDS

Laredo Chamber of Commerce expressly agrees to maintain complete and accurate financial records of expenditures made by Laredo Chamber of Commerce and as requested by the Commissioner's Court, the County Auditor, or their designee, shall make the records available to the Commissioners Court, County Auditor of their designees, for inspection and review. Additionally, Laredo Chamber of Commerce shall permit representatives of the County, including but not limited to the County Auditor and independent auditor, access to the names, addresses, services rendered, and all other required documents related to the Laredo Chamber of Commerce performance under this contract. All such required records shall be clearly identified and readily accessible to the County for three (3) years after final payment under this contract, or after termination of this contract, whichever is later.

ARTICLE 8 COUNTY'S RIGHT TO TERMINATE

This contract may be terminated by County at any time on 30 days written notice to Laredo Chamber of Commerce and any remaining funds shall be returned.

ARTICLE 9 ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This contract supersedes any and all prior agreements between the County and Laredo Chamber of Commerce whether written or oral.

ARTICLE 10 NON-DISCRIMINATION

Laredo Chamber of Commerce shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant because of race, religion, color, sex, handicap or national origin.

ARTICLE 11 INDEMNIFICATION

Laredo Chamber of Commerce shall indemnify and hold County harmless from any and all claims arising out of the performance of its duties under this agreement.

ARTICLE 12 NOTICES

All notices called for or contemplated hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given when personally delivered or forty eight (48) hours after mailed to each party by certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid as follows:

ARTICLE 13 INCONSISTENCIES

Where there exists any inconsistency between this Agreement and other provisions of collateral contractual agreements that are made a part hereof by reference or otherwise, the provisions of this Agreement shall control.

ARTICLE 14 SEVERABILITY

If any item, provision, covenant or condition of this contract should be held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void or unenforceable, and such term, provision or condition is not an essential part of the contract and appears not to have been a controlling or material inducement to the making thereof, the same shall be deemed of no effect, and shall upon application of either party be stricken from the contract without affecting the binding force of the contract as it shall remain after omitting such provision.

ARTICLE 15 LAW OF TEXAS

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and shall be enforced in the Webb County, Texas.

ARTICLE 16 AMENDMENT

No changes to this Agreement shall be made except upon written agreement of both parties.

ARTICLE 17 HEADINGS

The headings used herein are for convenience of reference only and shall not constitute a part hereof or affect the construction or interpretation hereof.

ARTICLE 18 WAIVER

The failure on the part of any party to exercise or to delay in exercising, and no course of dealing with respect to any right hereunder shall operate as a waiver thereof; nor shall any single or partial exercise of any right hereunder preclude any other or further exercise thereof or the exercise of any other right. The remedies provided herein are cumulative and not exclusive of any remedies provided by law or in equity, except as expressly set forth herein.

ARTICLE 19 COUNTERPARTS

This Agreement may be executed in any number of and by the different parties hereto on separate counterparts, each of which when so executed shall be deemed to be an original, and such counterparts shall together constitute but one and the same document.

ARTICLE 20 TERMINOLOGY AND DEFINITIONS

All personal pronouns used herein, whether used in the masculine, feminine, or neutral, shall include all other genders; the singular shall include the plural and the plural shall include the singular.

ARTICLE 21 IMMUNITY

County does not waive or relinquish any immunity or defense on behalf of themselves, their trustees, commissioners, offices, employees and agents as a result of the execution of this Agreement and performance of the functions and obligations described herein.

ARTICLE 22 NO RIGHTS CREATED

Any other provision of this Agreement to the contrary notwithstanding, this Agreement shall not create any rights or benefits on behalf of any other person not a party to this Agreement, and this Agreement shall be effective only as between the parties hereto, their successors and permitted assigns.

ARTICLE 23 INCORPORATION OF RECITALS AND EXHIBITS

The Recitals and each exhibit attached hereto are hereby incorporated herein by reference for all intents and purposes, provided however that in the event of a conflict between this Agreement and its Exhibits, this Agreement shall control to the extent of such conflict.

ARTICLE 24 EFFECTIVE DATE

This agreement is effective as of the October 1, 2023, even if any signatures are made after that date.

"You'd be surprised!" Campaign

The "You'd be surprised!" campaign was created in 2020 with the purpose in mind to create a central theme that would be adaptable to different markets. This has proved highly successful. "You'd be surprised!" provides a generic brand that can be used to highlight Webb County's many visitor attractions. Whether directed at individuals whose interest lies in bird watching, hunting, history, sightseeing and shopping, or for the buiness-minded coference settings, "You'd be surprised!" generates interest to address each of those tastes.

In 2023-2024, the "You'd be surprised!" campain will be aimed at four specific markets:

- Shoppers (from both the U.S. and Mexican markets)

- Hunters

- Outdoor Sports and Ecotourism

- Business Conferences and Conventions

Program Name

"You'd be surprised!" Campaign

Shoppers: There are two types of shoppers that can be attracted to Webb County's retail industry—

- -- <u>Mexican Shoppers:</u> Mexican families, particularly residents of the northern region of Mexico, who historically travel to cities on the U.S. Mexico border for shopping sprees. Proposed reach: 200,000 households
- <u>U.S. Shoppers:</u> Residents of a radius 150 miles surrounding Webb County, who are attracted by the availability of Mexican imports at wholesale prices. Proposed Reach: 100,000 households.

Hunters: Webb County is renown for its prized population of whitetail deer. Capitalizing on this natural treasure, the Laredo Chamber of Commerce instituted the Cola Blanca Hunting Contest over three decades ago. The contest has grown to be one of the most popular of the South Texas area. This year, Cola Blanca intends to expand its reach for contest registration via expanded social media and website promotions, sponsor the Cola Blanca Clay Shoot Competition and once more host the Cola Blanca Awards Banquet. Anticipated reach: 100,000.

Outdoor Sports and Ecotourism: Webb County is home to the Casa Blanca State Park and the Casa Blanca Golf Course. Add to this ten months of sunshine and pleasant spring and autumn months and the result is a perfect mix for outdoor family enjoyment. This year the Laredo Chamber will once again host the Bola Blanca Golf Tournament as part of efforts to promote the Casa Blanca Golf Course and will expand on promotional activities to capitalize on Webb County's flora and fauna (e.g., promotion of bird watching).

Business Conferences and Conventions: Webb County's status as a major producer of natural gas and its rapidly evolving energy industry (solar and wind), and Laredo's (county seat) position in the world of trade and commerce as No. 1 port in the nation, increasingly attract the attention of major corporations. This results in increased interest by visitors for corporate purposes and a rising number of business meetings and conferences. "You'd be surprised!" will capitalize on this by developing institutional materials that promote available meeting facilities and those in the planning phase, i.e., Webb County's Fair & Exposition Complex. Proposed reach: 10,000

Tourists and History Buffs — Not listed as one of the major markets for the "You'd be surprised!" campaign, but, nonetheless, one of importance are the family-types simply interested in leisure trips and academic-types attracted by historical locations. The campaign proposes to collaborate with existing local organizations, e.g., Webb County's Historical Foundation, in an effort to increase visitors who fall under this category.
